


The Hoffman Family Foundation's vision is to leave a legacy of love, transforming lives and communities around the world.

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y trip to Uganda was a beautiful journey. I really missed the past two years not being able to hop on a plane and escape to this amazing place on the earth. My opportunity to return to Uganda came in early October 2021, amidst all the Covid regulations throughout the world. Lots of paperwork to gather, but I made it there and was greeted at the Entebbe Airport by Robert Kiwanuka, HFF Executive Director and Vinny Mawejje, HFF Sponsorship Coordinator.

After a day of rest at the Sheraton Hotel in Kampala our adventure began. Upon arriving at Rays of Grace, I was greeted by 50 of our older kids who were on campus attending a spiritual retreat organized especially for them. Later that day I check into my favorite respite "The Haven" on the Nile River which accommodates me when I arrive. Now when I return to Uganda it's like going home! Our extended family is there, and my how our family has grown over the past 7 years Tami and I have been coming.

The first thing I wanted to accomplish was to get a full campus picture taken. I hired a drone to come and take this amazing photo just to visualize all that God has accomplished since we first arrived in Uganda in 2015 and broke ground for Rays of Grace School. I strolled the campus with our staff, and it was nice to be back on the grounds again. The team is staying busy with the day-to-day operations that continue even without children present.

The focus of this trip was to review all the projects that are still in process and those new projects which are on the horizon to be birthed. We have learned that God's timing is always perfect.

In Uganda soccer is the number one sport. In 2017 land was purchased to build a soccer field where Rays of Grace Soccer Academy was established. And it is true....Build it and they will come. The field you can notice is in the rear of the campus photo. We have dreams of what can and will happen with this project which I will share shortly.

The school re-opened in January 2022, where about 450 people returned back to Rays of Grace, including teachers and staff, following a two-year mandate to close the schools in Uganda. Always something going on at the lodge too: great breakfast, the sounds and great views of the Nile River, the evening gatherings with our staff from Uganda and the many other folks you rub shoulders with. People from all over the world come to the Haven Lodge while visiting Uganda.

This trip was such a pleasure just to spend time sharing vision together with the HFF team. They are the ones who make our dreams a reality: our hands and feet.

My heartfelt thanks to my friends, family and Uganda for making this trip another wonderful memory to stash in my memory bank. We appreciate the many sponsors who sponsor these amazing children. We could not do this without you. Thank you all who help us financially with donations to the Hoffman Family Foundation for the operations and expansion of Rays of Grace. We are eternally grateful to each one of you.

A new vision I would love to expand on is to build above the soccer field a complex of lodging rooms with a large dining/kitchen conference area: a place where soccer teams can gather and tournaments can be held, a place where conferences can be facilitated as well. any seasons in life God permits you to encounter challenging situations. It's been two years of silence and no school at Rays of Grace. Teachers have been home with so many diverse minds due to COVID-19 pandemic. The most heartbreaking negative impact of the lock-down is that so many teenage girls and boys have dropped out of school; some got married and others had babies as a result of no purpose or guidance. The pandemic has done more harm to the economy in the world, leaving most of the people in Uganda struggling to survive.

But now it's a new season and the Joy of the Lord is covering Rays of Grace when schools re-opened this January 2022! Smiling faces fill our school campus, flowers are blooming more beautiful with the children, and our hearts warmed up with the rejuvenated love, care and joy of our children and teachers. Play areas are busy, classes are filled with activity, and most importantly our grounds are filled with laughter, praise and worship, having His name being glorified which means the world to us. The children are back in the school, and the grounds are lively once again. Indeed the King is amidst us all.

Now that schools are open, we are handling the challenges created by the lock-down on a day-to-day basis. We have registered a number of new children in our school with 60% of the old children returning. Some of the other children have relocated because of the pandemic, and some of the parents have lost the vision of having their children continue their education which is heartbreaking. Counseling and guidance classes are underway to help the children get back to the roots of learning and also being in community with each other again. We need a high-level of guidance of spiritual and physical direction to help them regain the right behaviors and spiritual growth.

We have currently improved the teaching using visual screens which we were able to install during the pandemic, and the children seem to really enjoy another way of learning. The renewal of the children's passion for school and Christ is a huge task ahead, but we know that with God all things are possible.

We have the new "Gifts of Promise" building which is 95% completed and will serve as our creative arts department which will include our music school and will support the school's praise and worship team with instruments which will excite the hearts of our children. This department will also include dance, art and drama for the kids. It will be exciting to see what talent develops here.

God has awakened my mind in this new awareness and through the crippling surprise of COVID-19 in the world that was never prepared for this kind of a situation. I think it has changed many of our perceptions. Just being able to gather together with each other: remembering to never take this for granted. Unfortunately, many organizations have failed to re-open; but I'm thankful that God has been faithful that our school is still standing strong and we are able to continue with the vision God has given us for this community. We pray to build a chapel at the school compound this year and also a new dining hall. We are thankful that we can keep moving each day with the joy and love for Rays of Grace as God continues to direct our paths as we keep moving forward in building His Kingdom.

Welcome back, kids! We have been waiting for such a time as this. New beginnings and new vision for the future!









ROOTED IN CHRIST

s the pandemic kept our kids from school our staff had a wonderful idea of bringing back a few of our older kids to host a 6-day spiritual camp for them. We had about 40 of our 14-17 year old kids come. This pandemic had really affected this age group. They were losing hope and afraid of what their future would hold. Everything came together beautifully. And Dave just happened to be in Uganda during this time as well to enjoy a few of our kids. We even had a worship team come and join our kiddos. USB (Universal Sporting Bridge) a local Ugandan NGO of athletic coaches helped lead the camp. The kids had devotion time together rooting them and strengthening them in Christ anchoring their lives in Him with worship time, games and fun team building activities. It had been so long since they had seen each one during the lockdown. Here are a few words from some of our attendees.....

Yes, the members of our Ugandan team are paid from the resources of our generous founders.





MEET FATIYA NAMUKWAYA


When I grow up I want to be a nurse!
